The Network of Centers for German and European Studies

In 1990 the DAAD started establishing a network of interdisciplinary Centers for German and European Studies at internationally renowned universities in the USA, Canada, Great Britain, France, the Netherlands, Poland, Russia, Israel, China, Japan and the Republic of Korea. Focussing their research and teaching activities on contemporary German and European matters, the Centers educate future generations of experts on Germany and Europe at the graduate and post-graduate level. Through their research, outreach and public events the Centers further contribute to an understanding of contemporary Germany in a wider European context.

The DAAD particularly aims to support and encourage the further development of a strong international and interdisciplinary network among the Centers. This ranges from joint research projects and academic conferences to activities aimed at creating closer ties among junior scholars, such as summer schools, study trips and graduate seminars.

The DAAD Centers worldwide come together for a biennial conference, alternating between Germany and a Center abroad. Following meetings in Amsterdam, Birmingham, Beijing and Berlin this year's conference is hosted by one of the network's three original Centers of Excellence: the BMW Center at Georgetown University in Washington, D.C.




